


8. INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL EDUCATION SYSTEM - MALTA

Higher education in Malta is regulated by the Education Act of 1998 and subsequent amendments and is the responsibility of the Ministry of Education and Employment.

Students access higher education institutions following thirteen years of schooling, which include six years of compulsory primary education, five years of compulsory secondary education and two years of post-secondary education (optional). As from school year 2013/2014, the secondary cycle in state schools consists of two separate phases: an initial two-year period in a Middle School followed by a three-year period in a Secondary School. Both phases in state schools are co-educational. In Post-secondary education students can follow a programme of their choice after they have completed compulsory education and are 16 years of age and older.

To gain entry to Higher Education, as well as Further Education, candidates may take a number of routes via the Malta College of Arts, Science and technology, the Institute of Tourism Studies, the University of Malta and private institutions. The first two institutions may be accessed at the age of 16 and offer programmes that may lead to higher education levels or may be accessed at 18 following post-secondary certifications, as with the University of Malta. In the latter case, students need to be in possession of two Advanced Level (Matriculation Certificate) subjects and four other subjects taken at Intermediate Level including Systems of Knowledge. They also need passes in the Secondary Education Certificate at grade 5 or better in Maltese, English Language and Mathematics. A non-Maltese candidate may offer his own language instead of Maltese. In order for foreign students to access higher education, they must have qualifications equivalent to the Matriculation Certificate, such as the General Certificate of Education at Advanced (A) levels, the International Baccalaureate and the American Advanced Placement System, to cite only a few.

The university structure has been reviewed according to the Bologna Process Framework, which envisaged the establishment of the European Higher Education Area by 2010. Tertiary education is provided by public institutions and a number of private tuition centres which also provide tertiary and/or higher education programmes through distance learning. In recent years, government has encouraged the take-up of tertiary and post-graduate education both locally and abroad through various scholarship schemes.

Academic level studies are divided in three stages. First stage is a Bachelor's degree obtained in three to five years depending on the field of study. Second stage leads to the award of a Master's Degree or a Postgraduate diploma after a period of one or two years of study and the third stage leads, after at least three years of study following the award of a Master's Degree, to a Doctoral Degree, wherefore candidates are required to submit a thesis after a period of research on an approved topic.

The Malta Qualifications Framework was set up in June 2007 and was referenced to the European Qualifications Framework for Lifelong Learning in September 2009.
